#### **LONGTIME RESIDENT TAKES NEIGHBORHOOD INSPECTOR POST**

WEST CARROLLTON, Ohio – Carl Enterman has lived in West Carrollton for 39 of his 43 years.

His familiarity with the city streets and residents made him a natural fit for the neighborhood inspector position that he recently started with the city of West Carrollton.

Enterman will work through October to insure that residents abide by grass, tree-and-shrubs, trash, and signage regulations in the part-time, seasonal position.

“I’ve done inspections before in previous jobs,” he said. “I know that you need to be personable and thick-skinned.”

Enterman said that he hopes he will be successful in helping residents understand the importance of fixing the violations and maintaining their properties.

“Hopefully they will see how fixing code violations can reflect on the city’s image and property values in the area,” he said.

Some guidelines for residents:

- Grass can be no longer than 12-inches and lawn needs to be free from debris. If the yard is not mowed, the city will hire a contractor to mow and issue a \$150 fee in addition to the mowing costs.

- Trees need to have a 14-foot clearance from the road and 8-foot clearance from the sidewalk.
- Garage sale signs can not be placed in the public right-of-way. If violations occur, the signs will be removed immediately.

Enterman is owner of KME Development Co. and is also an assistant coach for West Carrollton's varsity baseball team. His great-grandfather owned West Carrollton Parchment Co. He lives in the city with his wife and son.
