FREE SUMMER MOVIE NIGHTS TO BE HELD AT WILSON PARK

WEST CARROLLTON, Ohio - The parks and recreation department and the West Carrollton Church of the Nazarene are partnering to provide three free movie nights this summer in Wilson Park.

The first family movie event will be held at 9 p.m. on Friday, June 8 near the tennis courts and park shelter located at 350 Wilson Park Dr.

Other movie nights will be held on Friday, July 6 and Friday, Aug. 3. Rain dates are scheduled for Saturday, July 7, and Saturday, Aug. 4. The future movies have not been determined.

The church is providing the movie equipment and the rental costs. "Our church is simply interested in providing something fun that families can afford to do together," Richardson said. "We want to be an asset to the community."
