Ms. Nash thanked everyone who participated in the Citizens Fire Academy and thanked the staff who helped with this event.

Mr. Robinson spoke about the West Carrollton School Board meeting the other night and how the city is trying to get funds for remodeling the schools. The state will fund the project 81% and the taxpayers will be responsible for 19%. Estimate for the total project spread out over about 5 years will be around \$132 million dollars. The bond issue will be on the November ballot and if you have questions please contact someone in the school district for answers. They will replace our seven buildings with four buildings. There will be a K-1st grade building, $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$ grade building, $5^{th} - 6^{th}$ grade building, and $7^{th} - 12^{th}$ in another building. The figures are 5.7 mils and will cost the taxpayer with a property of \$100,000 \$16.50 a month more on your property taxes or \$.50 a day unless you have a homestead tax exemption which would be about \$4 a month less.

Carrollton Centre Streetscape Plan

Mr. Gaines presented to council the plan for refreshing and upgrading the streetscape for the Carrollton Centre area along North Elm street between Main and Central Avenue. The City has received CDBG grant funds to assist in paying for the project, which has a budget of \$140,000. Mr. Gaines also stated the plans have been shared with the adjoining property owners and businesses and they are supportive of the project.

Council asked about lighting improvements and express some concern with a few of the proposed design elements. After a lengthy discussion, it was the consensus of council to proceed with the project.

Downtown Corridor Streetscape Plan

Mr. Gaines also discussed the process and costs to add a streetscape element to the downtown corridor plan. While the original plan included areas of opportunity for streetscape elements, it was not specific as to a plan. Mr. Robinson had previously mentioned his desire to pursue such a plan in conjunction with all of the other activity going on along the riverfront.
