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WORK SESSION

Discussion on this item was tabled until a future council meeting.

FIRE DEPARTMENT STAFFING PLAN

Mr. Townsend began the discussion with a summary of the the results of the Citizens Survey on the question of support for an emergency services levy. A majority (52%) indicated a willingness to support a tax levy in the \$100 to \$125 per year range. Mr. Townsend then presented the options and costs of various tax levies within the limits of this support. After a brief discussion, it was the consensus of council that a 3.5 mil renewal property tax levy was preferred. At the City's current assessed valuation, 3.5 mils would generate \$560,000 per year and cost the owner of a \$100,000 home \$122.50 per year (\$10.20 per month). A copy of Mr. Townsend's presentation is available upon request from the office of the City Manager.

Chief Barnett presented options for increasing the amount of full-time staff in the fire department to reduce the dependence on part-time employees and stabilize station staffing. The option that would conform to the established limits of the survey results, while addressing needs in both full-time and part-time staffing would, would include the hiring of four (4) additional full-time Firefighter/Paramedics, increase part-time salaries by 10%, and set-aside funding to incentivize EMT's to attend paramedic school. The estimated cost of this option is approximately \$521,000. A copy of Chief Barnett's presentation is available upon request from the office of the Fire Chief.

Council asked if there would be any consideration for funding for the police department as the survey question asked about emergency services and not specifically fire. Mr. Townsend indicated that given the limitations of the survey results along with the demonstrated needs and costs of the fire department proposal, additional funds for the police department would require consideration of a levy that exceeds the 3.5 mils. After a lengthy discussion, it was agreed that Chief Barnett's option 2 proposal was appropriate as it addressed both full and part-time staffing needs. It was also agreed that the levy would be put before the voters during the March 17th primary next year to avoid potential conflict with the school district levy this November. Council further directed the Manger to meet with Chief Woodard to discuss adding an element of support for the police department and report back at a future council work session.
