We are looking at trying to coordinate what the road will look like and what those needs will be as the volleyball project develops. As part of the future plans of the West Central Avenue there will be a traffic impact study mainly between Elm Street and Miami Avenue and design work to take the wall down between the road and the site. In looking at future land configurations, there is a possibility of on-street parking, left turn lanes in and out of the site, as the main light for the project will be at West Central Avenue and Miami Avenue.

Southard Ridge Detention Basin Project

Mr. Norton and Mr. Enterman briefed council on the status of a detention basin repair project associated with Southard Lane. The basin began to fail a few years ago, and a more permanent fix is now required. A cost to repair the basin has not been established as yet. An engineer will need to be retained to come up with a plan. All costs associated with the project will be assessed to the residents of Southard Ridge.

Mrs. Denlinger stated that staff has met with the effected residents and given them an opportunity to retain their own contractor and/or legal counsel. Since we have not been notified that they have, it is now time to move forward. The estimated cost to retain an engineer to develop a repair plan is between \$3,000 and \$4,000.

After a brief discussion, it was the concerns of council to proceed as planned. Council thanked Mr. Norton, Mr. Enterman, and Mrs. Denlinger for an excellent briefing.
