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GetGo proposes first Dayton-area location

Convenience store chain GetGo Café & Market is eyeing its first Dayton region location. If approved, the development would bring vitality to a lacking shopping center. A GetGo fueling station, convenience store and drive-through has been proposed at 2100 S Alex Road in West Carrollton. To make room for the 24-hour 6,300-square-foot store and six double-sided fuel pumps, a former U.S. Bank will be demolished.

GetGo representative and site planner Jonathan Wocher, principal at Cincinnati consulting firm McBridge Dale Clarion, said GetGo already has a contract to lease the 1.6 acres property from Imperial Shopping Center owner Watertower Partners LLC.

The development is anticipated to provide numerous new employment opportunities to the area and redevelop the infilled commercial site, breathing new life into the shopping center which is suffering from vacant tenant spaces.

Alongside McBridge Dale Clarion, Miamisburg architect CESO Inc. is also involved in the project according to municipal documents. A timeline has not been disclosed as the plan is still awaiting approval from the city.

If the project is approved, GetGo will join current tenants including Cousin Vinny's Pizza, Yellow Rose Nightclub and Hook Fish and Chicken.

GetGo, a Giant Eagle company, operates more than 260 convenience stores across Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Maryland and West Virginia. Some of their locations include WetGo, a car wash sector of the brand.

The Pittsburg-based convenience chain offers breakfast, lunch, dinner and snack options – with both made-to-order and grab-and-go capabilities.
