

## River District Brand Announcement

West Carrollton has been working to get the real estate pieces in place for a waterfront revitalization for over 15 years. And now, you're starting to see the potential, and the progress! You've likely heard the exciting news about the White Water Park being designed for the river below the dam, and you've probably heard a little about the future development of Erie Park into a commercial retail and restaurant development with other amenities and economic development to follow. With those BIG projects in the work, it was time for the City to begin development and planning for the brand and the intended boundaries of the "River District".

In the spring, council hired a local branding firm, with a designer

who grew up in West Carrollton, to help design the logo for the newly designated River District. That logo was created over a 6-month period with input from staff and council. The logo will be an important part of the designation of the River District in West Carrollton and will help with the wider regional and national marketing efforts to attract visitors to West Carrollton and the new amenities being planned for the River District.

While a "brand" is truly more than a logo, and there is much more work to do to deepen the impact of the River District for the benefit of West Carrollton, the foundational branding effort for this project and the logo and visual brand standards is complete. River District!

Why license your pup? First and foremost - it's the law! In Ohio, all dogs three months of age or older must be licensed. Most importantly though, it provides a quick and accurate way of notifying you if someone finds your pet.

3 QUICK & EASY ways to purchase a license:

• **Online** - apply or renew online at [www.mcoho.org/dogs](http://www.mcoho.org/dogs)

• **Mail** - print a blank application from the website and mail it in with a check

• **In-person** - Stop by the Auditor's Office or Animal Resource Center, or visit [www.mcoho.org/dogs](http://www.mcoho.org/dogs) and find an outpost near you

In addition, tags will be sold at the West Carrollton Civic Center from 5 - 7 p.m. on Thursday, Jan. 19 and 26.

Licenses are \$20 for dogs that have been spayed or neutered and \$24 for those dogs that are unaltered.

# In Your City

## Stay Warm This Winter, While Practicing Home Heating Safety Guidelines

*The Facts: Space heaters are responsible for 1/3 of home heating fires & about 80% of home heating fire deaths.* (according to NFPA reports)

While most families look for alternative ways to heat throughout their home, it's also important that we teach the whole family about home heating safety strategies that will keep us warm and safe all winter long. Share this information to friends and loved ones that may be using space heaters during the upcoming cold months.

### Fireplaces inspections

- Have your firebox and chimney inspected at least once per year for cracks and obstructions.
- Don't let creosote buildup in your chimney, it could cause a chimney or liner fire.
- Never burn paper documents, trash or charcoal in your fireplace. It gives off deadly carbon monoxide and will increase the soot buildup in the flue.
- Make sure the damper is open when using the fireplace and remains open if there are hot ashes remaining in the firebox, at for least 24 hours.
- When you clean or remove the ashes, place them in a metal container to the outside on solid ground for at least 24 hours. Dowse the ashes with water if possible. Do NOT place the container on a wood or combustible surface and keep away from any combustible structures.

### Furnaces

- Before you turn on your furnace, have it inspected yearly by a qualified professional. Change the filters monthly.
- Check the condition of the automatic controls and

emergency shutoffs. Know where your electrical panel is for the furnace and make sure you have at least a three-foot clearance around the panel. Also keep the panel accessible for the fire department when needed in an emergency.

- Keep all combustibles away from the furnace. Check your chimney for cracks or loose bricks and seal all flue openings with solid masonry.
- Have a carbon monoxide near the furnace and or firebox, gas or wood installed per the manufacturer's recommendation. Test your Carbon Monoxide alarms monthly.

### Space Heaters

- Inspect your space heater, does it have a working safety light, alarm, automatic shut-off switch when tipped, and a cut-off device to prevent overheating. Look for the UL listing.
- Plug directly into an outlet, not an extension cord or surge protector. Keep all objects, people and pets at least three feet away from the heater.
- Never use a space heater in your bathroom. Water and electric appliances don't mix.

## Trim Trees and Shrubs in The Right-of-Way

West Carrollton City Council strives to protect property values and enhance the image and safety of all of our neighborhoods. Low hanging tree branches and/or overgrown shrubs not only cause safety concerns, but can also decrease curb appeal. We ask all property owners to review the following code guidelines:

- Tree/shrub branches must be less than 14 feet vertically from the road/alley.
- Tree/shrub branches must be less than 8 feet vertically from the public sidewalk.
- Tree/shrub branches must be less than 12 inches horizontally from the road/alley or sidewalk.



The City asks that property owners trim trees/shrubs not meeting these guidelines by April 15th, 2023 to avoid an invoice from the city to complete this work for you.

## What can you do to prevent stormwater pollution?



### 1. Remember: Only rain belongs in the drain!

Don't dump anything down storm drains. Be sure to clear away leaves and debris.



### 2. Minimize runoff by not over-watering your lawn and garden.

Keep sprinklers on a timer to avoid pooling water.

### 3. Use lawn or garden chemicals sparingly.

Choose organic alternatives when possible and check the weather forecast to avoid applying them before a storm.



### 5. Clean up pet waste.

Bag up pet waste and dispose of it in the trash to prevent harmful bacteria from washing into local waterways.

### 6. Make sure storm drains are not running in dry weather.

A stormwater system is designed to carry stormwater. If it hasn't rained in 72 hours, it should not be flowing. Call your municipal stormwater contact if it does.



### 7. Install a rain barrel to capture roof runoff.

This helps prevent stormwater from reaching waterways and reduces the potential for pollution.

### 8. Do not drain your pool, spa, or fountain to a storm drain.

Allow chlorine to dissipate for several days. Test the water to ensure the residual chlorine is zero before slowly draining to a landscaped area. You may be able to drain to a sanitary sewer. Contact the City for more information.

Recently approved new hiring process for entry level police officer candidates for West Carrollton brings exciting new opportunities for non certified officers.



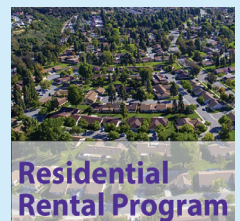

## Residential Rental Registration Helps You!

In 2016, West Carrollton City Council adopted the Residential Rental Registration and Education Program. This program's main goal is to help residents by improving the condition of rental properties in the city, without creating an undue burden on tenants or owners. By improving conditions, we will by default, improve the community's public health, safety and welfare and elevate the condition and value of our neighborhoods as a whole.

All rental properties located in the city must be registered with the Montgomery County Auditor, as required by Ohio law. Registration is free, however, late fees can be assessed. Every two years, the City will inspect the exterior (and common areas of multi-family properties) of all rentals in the city. The initial inspection and a follow-up inspection, if required to correct any violations, are free. If a violation continues, the owner will incur a re-inspection fee and owners who fail two consecutive inspections will be required to attend continuing education provided by rental industry partners.

**Hintermeister Park** offers one shelter (no electricity), a playground, basketball court and restrooms.

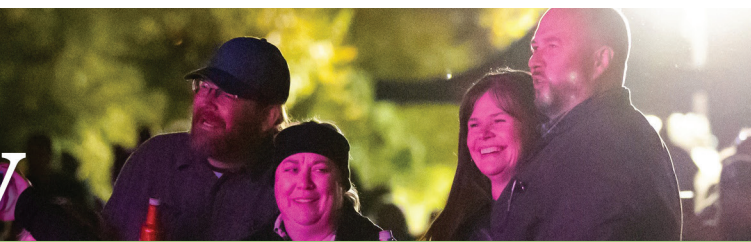

## West Carrollton Schools

West Carrollton School District students, staff and administrators have met with architect representatives from Levin Porter and representatives from the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) to discuss ideas regarding the construction of a combined Middle School and High School campus that will be one building, but have spaces separated between Middle School and High School students. The campus, along with a new building to house students in grades two through four, is Phase II of the district's construction plan.

Passage of a Building Bond Issue in November, 2019, allowed the school district to move forward with a two-phase construction plan with the community investing 19% and the OFCC paying for 81% of the co-funded cost for four new buildings. Phase I was the construction of a new Early Childhood Center that houses preschool through first grade students and the new Intermediate School that houses fifth and sixth grade students. Both of those buildings opened for the beginning of the 2022-23 school year.

Although no date has yet been set, the community will soon be invited to be part of the planning process. The date will be advertised at westcarrollton-schools.com and on the district Facebook page at West Carrollton City Schools.
