



Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

West Carrollton is one of 16 recipients of a grant from the Ohio EPA Diesel Mitigation Trust Fund. The \$15,000 grant will be used to fund the installation of a Level 2 Electric Vehicle charging station. The charging station will be located at 'The Point' on E. Central Ave. near exit 47 of I75 and will be able to service two vehicles at a time. The cost for usage of the stations is still being determined but, will be in alignment with other stations around the area. People will be able to

pay using a membership card, credit card or a mobile app. The city plans to install the charging station by the end of 2021.

"We are excited to bring this service to not only the citizens of West Carrollton but, to those traveling through the city. Future customers will be able to charge their car and take advantage of nearby restaurants or take a walk along the path by the Great Miami river," said Mike Lucking, economic development director.





Community Development

In April, city council members unanimously approved ordinances that allow a local company, Eros Investments, to help the city in creating new housing and renovate existing housing. Developer Craig Kellogg of Eros Investments, is in the process of acquiring these properties in the city. Renovation is already underway at 323 E. Central Ave., the former Historical Society home.

There are several vacant, city-owned lots that were acquired over the years with the intent of clearing the properties for future development. The lots either had homes damaged by fire or became nuisances in their respective

neighborhoods. Kellogg plans to construct new homes on the following lots: 111 W. Pease Ave., 1320 Alex Rd., 505 N. Burns St., with anticipated selling prices in the \$150,000 range. Kellogg will also be investing in and building a home at 1201 Sherwood Forest Dr., and expects this property will sell in the \$250,000 range.

"We're excited about the new investment in the neighborhoods around the city and pleased that construction will be happening soon," said Mike Lucking, economic development director.


a couple) will receive the award each

WCPD Wins Award

The West Carrollton Police Department (WCPD) received an award through the Destination Zero initiative – a part of the National Law Enforcement Memorial and Museum designed to help agencies improve the health and safety of law enforcement officers across the country. WCPD won for being the top department in the 'General Officer Safety' category.

As our police department continues to adapt to the changing times, it works hard to keep officers safe and healthy. The department's program approach has four key tenets - Physical Fitness, Mental Fitness, Spiritual Fitness and Emotional Fitness. The program includes a modernized approach to uniforms and appearance, load bearing vests, an on-duty work out program, crisis intervention training, peer support training, a police chaplain program and enhanced ballistic equipment in each patrol car. "Ensuring officers return home safely, both mentally and physically, is the most important consideration when implementing these programs. We are very honored to have received this award," said Doug Woodard, police chief.

New CSI Equipment

The police department recently applied for and received a grant from the Ohio Department of Public Safety to obtain a 'Trimble Robotic Total Station.'The Total Station creates animations of traffic crashes and crime scenes and provides the ability to measure and diagram scenes using two and three-dimensional imaging. And the equipment can be operated by a single officer, if needed.

By using the equipment, it gives the police department the ability to have a truer and more accurate representation

of a scene more quickly as the Total Station scans the area and performs large numbers of calculations that would have been done singularly in the past.
