Fire Prevention Week October 3-9

Did you know that Fire Prevention Week began in 1925? President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed the week be observed nationally to commemmorate the Great Chicago Fire of Oct. 8, 1871.

During this week every year, children, adults and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Our W.C. Firefighters have provided public education in conjunction with the schools for over 25 years.

The National Fire Protection Association's (NFPA) theme for 2021 is "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety!" The theme will educate people about the different sounds smoke and carbon monoxide detectors make and provide information about devices a person who is deaf or hard of hearing could use to ensure they are safe in their homes.

This year – due to covid considerations - the fire department will be providing a video to show children in class.

Fire Dept. Grants

W.C.'s Fire Department recently received two grants. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security awarded an approximately \$150,000 from the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) fund. AFG's grant program is in place to protect the health and safety of the public and firefighting personnel against fire and fire-related hazards.

The department plans to purchase 21 self-contained breathing apparatus which contain a number of pieces including air packs, cylinders, individual face pieces and RIT packs which are portable air supply equipment to use as an emergency air supply when a member is low on air or is out of air and in need of help.

"These will replace our current equipment which is 11 to 12 years old. We plan to have these purchased and begin using them by the end of the year," said Fire Chief Chris Barnett.

Additionally, an EMS grant was awarded through the Ohio Department of Public Safety, for almost \$2700 which will be used to purchase EMS-related supplies.

"We're always so thankful and humbled when we are selected to receive grant money so we can better help our community and keep our citizens and firefighters safe," Barnett stated.

Police Dept. Gets New Body Cams

W. C. City Council recently approved the purchase and use of body cameras for the city's police officers. These cameras will supplement the in-car cameras that are already in use. While in-car cameras' functionality is limited due to being mounted in a stationary position, body cameras will move with the officers and can provide a different perspective. Officers will carry the camera inside his/her vest with the lens exposed. A detached device that looks like a watch can be worn to operate the camera. Although there are a few limitations, such as the lack of a 'peripheral' sight line, these devices are a great addition to the department's toolbox. Another unique feature is the ability of the camera to be remotely accessed so, that it can be livestreamed, if needed.

"Our department is looking forward to using this new technology as it provides us with another tool that will offer additional protection for the public as well as department members," said Police Chief Doug Woodard.

New Firefighter

We'd like to welcome Ross Gaby as the newest full-time member of the W.C. Fire Department. Ross spent two and a half years with us as a part-timer then moved to a full-time position with another city before coming back to West Carrollton in April 2021.

"Thankfully, we were able to bring him back to West Carrollton to fill a position that became available. It's a privilege and honor for us to have him in our department," said Fire Chief Chris Barnett. When we asked Ross what he likes about working here - other than his fellow firefighters, of course – he added, "I've come to realize that the camaraderie makes all the difference during long shift hours. And I'm happy to be working in and serving the community of West Carrollton again."

Ross keeps busy in his free time, too. He kayaks, hikes and volunteers at places like Carillon Historical Park. He's also a blacksmith, works as a Bee keeper in conjunction with Wright Patterson Airforce base and is working towards his private pilot's license.
