NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST CARROLLTON, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO, THAT: Section 1. The city of West Carrollton hereby declares its opposition to the Federal Communications Commission's proposed Declaratory Ruling and Third Report and Order regarding state and local governance of small cell wireless infrastructure deployment known as Accelerating Wireline Broadband Deployment by Removing Barriers to Infrastructure Investment, WC Docket No. 17-84 and WT Docket No. 17-79. Section 2. The city of West Carrollton hereby urges the FCC to allow comprehensive state legislation, such as that codified in the Ohio Revised Code, Chapter 4939, govern the placement, installation, and maintenance of small cell facilities, as those regulations are reflective of the needs, issues, conditions, and concerns of that state's communities and constituents. Section 3. That a copy of this Resolution be filed with the FCC and forwarded to U.S. Representatives Steven Chabot, Michael Turner, and Warren Davidson and to U.S. Senators Robert Portman and Sherrod Brown.
