UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Ordinance 3762 – An Ordinance To Make Appropriations For Current Expenses
And Other Expenditures Of The City Of West Carrollton, State Of Ohio, During The Fiscal
Year Ending December 31, 2023, Amending Ordinance 3757, And Repealing Any Ordinances
In Conflict Herewith.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Ordinance 3763</u> – An Ordinance Imposing A Nine Month Moratorium On The Issuance And Processing Of Permits For Dispensaries, Cultivators Or Processors Of Adult Use Cannabis Within The City Of West Carrollton, Ohio And Declaring An Emergency.

Ms. Denlinger presented Ordinance 3763. She explained this ordinance, if passed, will place a nine-month moratorium on the issuing of permits for adult use cannabis

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businesses within the City of West Carrollton. She further explained after the passage of State Issue 2, section 3708.03 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that the Division of Cannabis has 9 months to adopt rules to establish the standards and procedures for the implementation of the adult use cannabis program. Additionally, the Ohio General Assembly is currently working on amendments to Issue 2. City staff is in need of additional time to review the rules and any modifications made to determine the potential impact on allowing adult use cannabis operators within the city. Mr. Dobson asked if this would impact adult use of marijuana in private homes. Ms. Denlinger answered residents will still be able to partake as the law allows.

Mrs. Tomlin moved, seconded by Mayor Sanner to approve Ordinance 3763. A vote was taken: Mr. Barnhart-yes, Mrs. Fryman-yes, Mr. Tilton-yes, Mr. Dobson-yes, Mrs. Tomlin-yes, Mrs. Zennie-yes, and Mayor Sanner-yes.

Mr. Townsend stated with the passage of Ordinance 3763, that concludes the legislative business for 2023. He recommended the cancellation of the meeting on December 19th. He also gave a speech regarding the time he spent in public service and as the city manager. Discussion on 2024 Special Events/Wilson Pool

Mrs. Dillin discussed with council the proposed schedule of special events for 2024. She specifically asked if there were any thoughts on new events, or did council wish to keep doing what we are doing. Suggestions were made to bring back fireworks, develop a community festival, maybe the ballon glow or other smaller, less expensive events. After a lengthy discussion, Mrs. Dillin thanked council for the feedback. She will get with Christian and come back after the first of the year with a specific events program.

Mr. Mattingly discussed with council a request from Miamisburg to offer resident rates to their citizens while their pool undergoes a two-year renovation. Mr. Mattingly also discussed a proposal form the Parks board to have a resident only pool day on Sunday.

After a lengthy discussion, it was decided offer residents early entry on Sundays, not the full day and charge Miamisburg residents a rate equal to what they are currently paying, which is more than WC residents, but less than the non-resident rate.
