
Police Department Awarded \$12,000 from Body Worn Camera Micro-Grant

In November 2024, the West Carrollton Police Department (WCPD) was awarded a \$12,000 grant from the Small, Rural, and Tribal Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Micro-Grant Program. This initiative, part of the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) under the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) at the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) and Justice & Security Strategies (JSS), aims to support small law enforcement agencies in adopting or enhancing body-worn camera programs.

The Bureau of Justice Assistance selected WCPD out of numerous applicants, recognizing the department's commitment to advancing transparency and accountability through its BWC program. The grant enabled WCPD to purchase additional body-worn cameras.

WCPD has long utilized in-car cameras and, in 2021, introduced body-worn cameras as part of its policing toolkit. Officers wear these cameras during their shifts. and they feature advanced functionalities. Recording can be initiated manually by tapping the camera or automatically triggered by specific events, such as:

- Officers engaging in a pursuit.
- Activating sirens and exiting the patrol car.
- Unholstering a firearm.
- Detecting an officer down, complete with **GPS** coordinates sent for assistance.



Chief Woodard emphasized the importance of this technology, stating:

"I believe body-worn cameras are a valuable tool in modern policing. They enhance transparency, foster trust between our officers and the community, and provide critical evidence when investigating incidents. The West Carrollton Police Department is committed to using body-worn cameras as part of our dedication to accountability and our desire for continuous improvement in serving the citizens of our community." The department uses body-worn cameras for various purposes, including documenting interactions with victims, witnesses, suspects, and recording critical incidents. These recordings are vital for investigations and provide clarity during police-public encounters. Additionally, the department reviews monthly reports detailing camera usage, uploads, incidents involving force, and citizen complaints.

This grant bolsters WCPD's ongoing efforts to maintain and integrate up-to-date technology into its operations. With these new cameras, the department is better equipped to serve and protect the West Carrollton community.

West Carrollton Secures Brownfield Remediation Grant

The City of West Carrollton, in partnership with the Montgomery County Land Bank, has received a \$1.898 million Brownfield Remediation Grant from the Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) to begin transforming the former paper manufacturing wastewater treatment site at 4000 Hydraulic Road. With the City contributing \$650,263 in matching for redevelopment, supporting West Carrollton's larger vision for the Whitewater Park and River District projects. The grant funds will go toward demolishing structures, soil remediation, and preparing environmental reports for Ohio and U.S. EPA approvals. This project, expected to take 18-24 months, marks an essential step in creating a development-ready parcel along the river.

City Manager Amber Holloway expressed her gratitude, stating, "Securing this grant enables us to take the next step in the remediation and revitalization of this site. We are grateful for the support of the Montgomery County Land Bank and the Ohio Department of Development."

This grant and the preparation of this site for ambitious \$75 million public-private project in the City's River District. The City's goal is for this property to serve as the operations center for the City's planned Whitewater Park.

PROTECT YOUR PIPES THIS WINTER: **ESSENTIAL TIPS TO PREVENT FREEZING**

WEST CARE

It's time to think about freezing pipes! If the temperature is 20 degrees or below, you could be subject to freezing pipes. The following suggestions will help to keep your winter water supply flowing:

- Leave a tiny trickle from your faucets! This protects pipes in two ways: It prevents pressure from building up inside pipes and creates a constant flow of water through them, which makes freezing less likely.
- Turn up the heat in your home.

Open vanity or cabinet doors so warm air can reach the pipes under sinks.

If you have exposed pipes inside closets or pantries, leave doors open.

Disconnect garden hoses from outdoor faucets. Even "frostproof" faucets can burst if a hose is connected.

Keep the garage door closed.

If your meter and/or pipes are located in a crawl space, insulating them or providing a heat source nearby may be necessary. If you experience reduced water flow, heat the most vulnerable pipes (usually in basements, crawl spaces, or near exterior walls) with a hair dryer. Leave the faucet on while you apply heat. As the ice melts, the flow will increase.

Know Your Code

To ensure the safety, comfort, and well-being of occupants, it is essential to "Know Your Code." The following code is established for heating facilities in residential occupancies:

§158.35 HEATING FACILITIES.

(B) Residential occupancies. Dwellings shall be provided with non-portable heating facilities capable of maintaining a room temperature of 68°F (20°C) in all habitable rooms, bathrooms, and toilet rooms based on the winter outdoor design temperature for the locality indicated in the Air Conditioning Contractors of America Manual J. Cooking appliances shall not be used, nor shall any type/style of portable space heater be used to provide space heating to meet the requirements of this section.

STAY SAFE THIS WINTER:



Carbon Monoxide Safety

Carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning is a year-round danger, but the risk significantly increases during the winter months as heating systems are heavily used and cars are sometimes mistakenly warmed in garages. This odorless, colorless gas can be deadly if precautions aren't taken. To protect your household, install batteryoperated CO detectors near sleeping areas and check batteries regularly. Have appliances like furnaces, water heaters, and chimneys serviced annually. Avoid using gas ovens for heating, and never operate generators or cars in enclosed spaces, including garages, even with doors open. Winter safety starts with awareness and preparation. 

2025 Dog License Renewal

It's that time of year again! The City of West Carrollton and Montgomery County Animal Resource Center have teamed up to make getting your dog licensed easier than ever.



Why License Your Dog?

Licensing isn't just a requirement-it's a quick way to ensure you're notified if your lost pet is found. All dogs 3 months or older must be licensed.

3 Easy Ways to License Your Dog:

- **1. In Person:** Purchase tags at the West Carrollton Civic Center on:
- Sunday, January 5, from 1-3 PM
- Wednesday, January 15, from 5-7 PM
- Wednesday, January 22, from 4-6 PM
 - 2. Mail: Print an application and mail it with a check
 - 3. Online: Apply or renew at www.mcohio.org/dog

License Fees:

- \$20 for all spayed/neutered dogs and dogs 9 months or younger
- \$24 for all unspayed/unneutered dogs

Exceptions for Unaltered Dogs:

The \$20 rate applies to dogs that qualify with veterinary certification due to age or medical condition, registered breeding/show dogs (AKC), and hunting dogs with a current hunting license.

Accepted Payment Methods:

- Cash (exact change preferred) or check
- Credit card (2.4% service fee applies)

bulk trash pick-up of the year from January 6-10 on your regular trash collection day. The city will also collect cut Christmas trees; please remember to remove all lights, tinsel, and decorations, and do not place trees in bags.

Bulk Trash Collection Guidelines:

- Glass items: Must be taped and wrapped.
- Fabric items (mattresses, box springs, couches, chairs): Must be wrapped in plastic.
- Brush & carpet: Must be bundled.
- Old appliances: Accepted for collection.
- Paint: Accepted for collection (must be properly
- Other bulk trash items: Accepted for collection.
- Boards and carpets: Nails must be removed.

Items Not Accepted:

- Concrete, rock, dirt, loose brush, firewood, tree
- Contractor or remodeling materials

Outside of Free Pick-up Dates:

Protecting Our Waterways: Stormwater Pollution Prevention

Did you know that everyday activities can impact the quality of our local waterways? Stormwater runoff can carry pollutants like chemicals, trash, and oils directly into our rivers and streams. Check out the graphics to discover simple ways you can help prevent stormwater pollution and keep our community's water clean!





BEFORE with debris blocking drain

AFTER with debris cleared from drain

What can you do to prevent stormwater pollution?



1. Remember: Only rain belongs in the drain!

Don't dump anything down storm drains. Be sure to clear away leaves and debris.



Use lawn or garden chemicals sparingly.

Choose organic alternatives when possible and check the weather forecast to avoid applying them before a storm.



5. Clean up pet waste.

Bag up pet waste and dispose of it in the trash to prevent harmful bacteria from washing into local waterways.





6. Make sure storm drains are not running in dry weather.

A stormwater system is designed to carry stormwater. If it hasn't rained in 72 hours, it should not be flowing. Call your municipal stormwater contact if it does.

8. Do not drain your pool, spa, or fountain to a storm drain.

Allow chlorine to dissipate for several days. Test the water to ensure the residual chlorine is zero before slowly draining to a landscaped area. You may be able to drain to a sanitary sewer. Contact the City for

Tax Season is Approaching!

As we approach tax season, the City of West Carrollton wants to help make the process as smooth as possible. Filing early can help you avoid long lines and stress. Our city staff is here to assist with your city tax return preparations at no cost.

Get Assistance at the Civic Center

City staff can help you complete your city tax paperwork in person, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the Civic Center. No appointment is necessary. Just bring copies of all W-2s, other sources of taxable income, and the first two pages of your federal 1040. This free service applies to City of West Carrollton tax returns only, not federal or state filings.





Options to Submit Your Tax Return

- 1. Online Filing: File your local income taxes conveniently online! Visit www.westcarrollton. org and navigate to the Finance/Income Tax page. Here, you'll find the city's online filing software, which allows you to file and pay electronically.
- 2. In-Person Drop-Off: Use the secure drop box at the Civic Center's utility window. Simply drop your paperwork into the box, and our tax team will handle the rest.
- **3. Mail-In:** Send completed tax forms, signed and accompanied by all necessary income documentation, to:

Important Deadlines and Requirements

Mark your calendars—April 15, 2025, is the final deadline for all tax filings and payments to avoid penalties. Whether you owe taxes or not, all West Carrollton residents aged 18 and over must file a city income tax return. Ensure all mailin forms are postmarked by April 15 to be considered on time.

The city's website provides more on tax filing information, including FAQs and additional resources.
