Ordinance No. 3809

Passed: July 8, 2025

**AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF WEST CARROLLTON, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2025, AMENDING ORDINANCE 3805, REPEALING ANY ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF WEST CARROLLTON, STATE OF OHIO, HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: That to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the said City of West Carrollton during the year ending December 31, 2025, and that Section 2 of Ordinance 3805, copies of which are attached hereto and made part thereof, be and the same hereby are amended as follows:

SECTION 3: And the Finance Director is hereby authorized to draw her warrants for payment of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore, approved by the board of officers, authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of Council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance.

SECTION 4: The City Manager shall have the authority to implement such interfund transfers and advances as are identified and approved (from both the budget presentation and this ordinance) by this appropriation ordinance, without further consent or approval of City Council. City Council has reviewed and approved expenditures within the General Fund by department and per O.R.C. 5705.38(C), the levels of budgetary control are appropriated accordingly within the budget presented and approved by City Council, prior to the adoption of the annual appropriation ordinance.

SECTION 5: The City Manager shall have the authority to determine the usefulness of City property and may dispose of obsolete or surplus items at his or her discretion after public notification, as permitted by local ordinances or the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 7: That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Municipality and its inhabitants for the reason that there exists an imperative necessity to make the necessary purchases in a timely manner to meet grant funding guidelines, so as to facilitate administration, daily operation and avoid practical and legal entanglements, and this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.

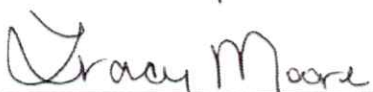

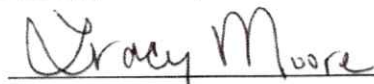
