City Orders New Fire Engine to Replace Aging Equipment

The City of West Carrollton Fire Department has ordered a new fire engine from Sutphen Corporation, with delivery expected next year, to replace a vehicle that has been in service for more than 30 years.

The nearly \$1 million purchase is funded by the 2025 fire levy, made possible through voter support. The new engine will improve reliability, reduce maintenance issues associated with aging equipment, and enhance safety for both firefighters and residents during emergency responses.

Fire Chief Barnett noted that replacing outdated apparatus is critical to maintaining dependable emergency services and ensuring crews have the tools they need to respond safely and efficiently.

This investment reflects the City's ongoing commitment to emergency preparedness, fiscal responsibility, and providing high-quality public safety services to the community.

Officer Eion Hogston Promoted to Sergeant



The West Carrollton Police Department recognized Eion Hogston with a promotion to Sergeant, officially sworn in on January 13, 2026.

Sergeant Hogston joined the department in May 2019 and has consistently demonstrated leadership, professionalism, and a strong commitment to public service. In 2021, he was named Police Department Employee of the Year, an honor reflecting his dedication to the department and the community it serves.

His service record includes Perfect Attendance awards in 2020 and 2021, a Department Commendation in 2019, and his appointment as Officer in Charge (OIC) in 2021, where he took on added supervisory responsibilities.

A native of Piqua, Ohio, Sergeant Hogston holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. His promotion reflects both his experience and the confidence placed in him to support the department's mission of public safety and community trust.

Annual Fire Hydrant Testing and Water Line Flushing Set for April 1st

West Carrollton Fire Department

Starting Tuesday, April 1st, the Fire Department will kick off its annual fire hydrant testing throughout the city. The tests, which will take place Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., are essential for ensuring the readiness of the fire hydrant system.

As part of this process, the Fire Department will also mark each hydrant with a distinct paint color to indicate that it has been tested. This year's color will be GREEN.

In addition to fire hydrant testing, the Service Department will also be flushing water lines during this period. Flushing is necessary to maintain the overall performance and health of the city's water system, ensuring that the flow and pressure remain optimal for everyday use and emergencies.

While these activities are underway, residents may experience temporary discolored water from their faucets or washing machines. If you encounter discolored water, we recommend running the cold water tap until it clears up. Additionally, to avoid potential fabric stains, it's best to hold off on doing laundry until the water runs clear.



Flood Safety: Know Your Risk and Stay Prepared

Flooding can occur quickly during heavy rain and severe spring storms, particularly in low-lying areas near streams and waterways. Taking a few preventative steps now can help protect property, reduce damage, and keep residents safe.

Residents are encouraged to understand their flood risk and take time to review important safety information before severe weather occurs. Knowing whether your property is located in a designated flood risk zone can help you make informed decisions about insurance coverage, home improvements, and emergency preparedness.

For simple steps residents can take to reduce flood risks and protect their property, review the Flood Safety Tips provided in the graphic.

Staying informed and prepared plays an important role in protecting homes, infrastructure, and emergency access routes during periods of heavy rain and potential flooding.

- If the road is underwater, turn around, don't drown.
- Get a building permit before building in a floodplain.
- Store valuables and insurance papers in a waterproof container.
- Ask your insurance agent if you are covered for flood damage.
- Keep all brush and debris out of streams and ditches; this helps flood water to flow freely.

Safety Reminder

Vacations and weekend getaways are important parts of summer, but they can also leave homes more vulnerable to theft and property crimes. Law enforcement agencies consistently remind residents that prevention begins with simple, proactive steps.

Before leaving home, ensure all doors and windows are securely locked. Using timers on interior lights can help create the appearance that someone is home, is a deterrent to criminals looking for easy targets. Residents are also encouraged to ask a trusted neighbor or friend to collect mail

and packages, or periodically check on the property while they are away.

In today's digital age, sharing travel plans on social media can unintentionally advertise that a home will be unoccupied. Law enforcement advises waiting until returning home to post vacation photos or updates.

To further assist residents, the West Carrollton Police Department offers vacation house checks, during which officers periodically patrol and visually check registered homes while residents are away to help deter suspicious activity. Residents can contact the Records Department at (937) 859-7465 to have their homes added to the vacation check list for added security and peace of mind while out of town.



Criminal activity often depends on opportunity. By taking these basic precautions and using available community resources, homeowners significantly reduce the chances of becoming a target. Small actions can make a major difference in keeping homes and neighborhoods safe throughout the summer months.



Proposed Charter Amendments on the May 5, 2026, Ballot

The City of West Carrollton City Council approved an ordinance to place proposed amendments to the City Charter on the ballot for the May 5, 2026, Primary/Special Election.



These same proposed changes to the City Charter were previously presented to voters at the November 2025 election. While the amendments were approved by voters, the City did not meet the specific requirements for public notice. As a result, the charter amendments did not take effect, and no changes were made to the City's Charter.

City Council has authorized placing the same charter amendments on the ballot in May for voter consideration.



Get Ready to Grow: Community Garden Plots Now Available

Spring is just around the corner, and with it comes the perfect opportunity to dig in, grow fresh produce, and enjoy time outdoors. The West Carrollton Community Garden, located next to the Senior Center at 10 E. Central Avenue, is now accepting reservations for the upcoming growing season.

For just \$10 per plot, residents can reserve a 4' x 12' garden space to grow vegetables, flowers, or herbs. The rental fee includes access to water for irrigation, giving gardeners the tools they need for a successful season. Garden plots are available on a first-come, first-served basis, so early registration is encouraged.



The gardening season runs from May 11 through October.

Know Your Code: Exterior Property Maintenance (Weeds & Grass)

As the growing season begins, the City of West Carrollton is sharing a reminder about exterior property maintenance standards that help keep neighborhoods safe, healthy, and well-maintained.

City code requires that grass and weeds be kept below eight inches in height, and that noxious weeds, as defined by the State of Ohio, be removed. These standards are in place to reduce pests, prevent the spread of invasive plants, improve visibility near sidewalks and streets, and protect neighboring properties.

Property owners, tenants, and others responsible for property maintenance are expected to monitor growth throughout the season and take action when grass or weeds exceed the allowed height. The City's approach is focused on education and voluntary compliance, and most concerns are resolved quickly once residents are aware of the requirements.

What This Means for Residents

- Grass and weeds must be kept under 8 inches
- Noxious weeds are not permitted
- Properties must be maintained throughout the growing season
- After annual public notice, grass and weeds must be cut each time growth exceeds 8 inches
- If a property is not maintained, the City may take action to address the issue and recover associated costs

The West Carrollton Branch of the Dayton Metro Library continues its commitment to being a welcoming space where everyone is free to belong. The library offers a wide range of inclusive services, assistive technology, and programs designed to support individuals of all abilities, ages, and learning styles.

Inclusive & Accessible Library Services

The library provides assistive technology to help ensure equal access to resources, including screen magnification and screen reading software, sign language video relay services, and an Assistive Technology Station equipped with a high-contrast keyboard, trackball mouse, task lighting, webcam, and magnification tools. Additional items such as noise-canceling headphones and portable magnifiers are also available for in-branch use.

Residents who need a sign language interpreter, assistive device, or language translation services are encouraged to contact the Dayton Metro Library's Ask Me Line at 937-463-2665 in advance so accommodations can be prepared.

File Your City of West Carrollton Taxes with Ease.

New online tax filing system now available

Tax season is here, and residents have multiple options to make filing easier. City of West Carrollton offers free in-person and on-line local income tax filing.

File Your City of West Carrollton Taxes with Ease

In-Person Assistance at the Civic Center

City staff can help you complete your City of West Carrollton income tax return in person, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at the Civic Center. No appointment is necessary.

Please bring:

- Copies of all W-2s
- Documentation for other sources of taxable income such as Schedule C, E, and 1099.
- The first two pages of your Federal 1040

This service applies only to City of West Carrollton tax returns and does not include federal or state filings.

Options to Submit Your Tax Return

- 1. Drop-Off:** Use the secure drop box at the Civic Center utility window.
- 2. In-Person:** Submit at the tax window, Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- 3. Mail-In:** Send completed tax forms, signed and accompanied by all necessary income documentation, to:

- 4. Online Filing:** File and pay electronically by visiting www.westcarrollton.org and navigating to the Income Tax page.

Important Deadlines and Requirements: April 15, 2026, is the final deadline for all tax filings and payments to avoid penalties. Whether you owe taxes or not, all West Carrollton residents aged 18 and over must file a city income tax return. Ensure all mail-in forms are postmarked by April 15 to be considered on time.

Free Federal & State Tax Preparation Help for Qualifying Residents

Residents with low to moderate income, including qualifying seniors, may be eligible for free federal and state tax preparation through the Dayton EITC Coalition's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. These services are not limited to City of Dayton residents and are available throughout the region.

IRS-trained volunteers help eligible individuals file their tax returns at no cost, ensuring access to credits such as the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) to maximize your potential refund.

VITA sites are open through April 15. The closest participating location to West Carrollton residents is the Miamisburg Community Center (937-866-8999), with additional sites available throughout the Dayton area.

To qualify, participants should bring:

- Photo ID
- W-2 forms and other income documents
- Social Security cards or ITINs for all household members
- Any IRS correspondence received
- Banking information for direct deposit (if desired)
